Time is fundamental to perceiving sound. This Sound Travels concert curated by NAISA explores time in very different ways. Chantal Dumas will premiere a new work that evolves from her "86400 seconds" project which compresses the passage of time on a global scale into a thirty minute fixed media work. Stijn Demeulenaere's video work "Nothing's going to happen to us..." examines the reconstruction of a single event in time – an armed conflict - told by the person who experienced it first hand. And Brian Connolly's work "Track" explores time at the micro level to produce acoustic beating effects and other psychoacoustic phenomena.
